On October 1, 2024,
Dean Hadi-Tabassum was awarded
the Department of Education's
Hawkins Center of Educational

Excellence federal grant, a value of \$1.98 million. Its purpose is to increase our pipeline of candidates entering bilingual education. The funding will be used to develop dual credit high school pathways to education careers from Hispanic Serving School Districts in the western suburbs of Chicago, \$500,000 in scholarships for bilingual/ESL endorsements, affinity groups for students of color in teacher education, mentoring programs between bilingual preservice and in service teachers and a summer dual language academy for the Midwest.




Theresa Robinson, Associate Professor of Education; Director of the Noyce PRIDE STEM Teacher Scholars Program; Program Director of Secondary Education


Debra K. Meyer, Professor of Education

Here is the latest news from our Educator Licensure Officer, Michael Jankiewicz, Ed.D.

TEACHER PERFORMANCE ASSESSMENT

The Illinois School Code requires teacher candidates to pass a teacher performance assessment during student teaching in order to obtain a professional educator license. ISBE will be creating its own system, procedures and rubrics for a teacher performance system by June 2025. The teacher performance assessment will be aligned to applicable Illinois Professional Educator Standards, Culturally Responsive Teaching and Learning Standards and the state's evaluation system. The School of Education will track how their

teacher candidates perform on the new TPA from ISBE.

CONTENT TESTS

ISBE may allow content test subareas to be scored and retaken separately. ISBE plans to write this allowance into Rules Part 25. Rule updates are expected to be finalized in Fall 2025. Implementation of the updated Rules will be tied to the cyclical redesign of each test throughout the term of ISBE's contact with its testing vendor, Pearson.

Illinois Professional Educator Standards

Teacher education programs in Illinois are beginning the transition to the new Illinois Professional Educator Standards (IPES). They will replace the current Illinois Professional Teaching Standards (IPTS). All education programs must be aligned to the IPES by September 1, 2026.
