

The Nursing CAS application for the upcoming academic year opens on September 1, 2024. To be considered, please make sure your application is verified by Nursing CAS by January 15, 2025. Unverified applications will not be evaluated. We review applications on a rolling admission basis, contingent upon cohort availability. All application procedures are managed through Nursing CAS, with no supplemental applications required by Elmhurst University.

- A bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited U.S. institution or foreign equivalent, with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.20 on a 4.00 scale.
- Proficiency in college-level oral and written communication, as well as computer literacy.
- Prerequisites completed within the past five years with a grade of C or better:
 - Anatomy and Physiology (2 semesters with lab)
 - General Chemistry (with lab)
 - Microbiology (with lab)
 - Statistics
 - Social Science
