The additional Areas of Knowledge to be completed are: Cognitive and Behavioral Science (CBS), Inquiry into Ethics & Justice (IEJ), Religious Studies in Context (RSC), Literature (LIT), and Fine Arts (FA). Such courses can be found on the Elmhurst University website (https://www.elmhurst.edu/admission/transfer-adult-students/) under "Transfer Guides" or through "Transferology." *Students should have no more than two of the additional IC courses remaining for admission to the School of Education*.
